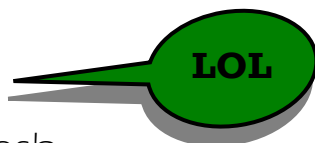

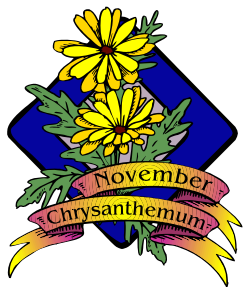

### CHARTER FOR COMPASSION

The Charter for Compassion was crafted by people all over the world and drafted by a multi-faith, multi-national council of thinkers and leaders. It is a cry for the return to the principles of compassion, which is the essence of the Golden Rule that is shared by all religions and traditions, and is based on the fundamental principles of universal justice and respect. Compassion insists in recognition of our common humanity, we treat everyone with justice, equality, and respect.

Xavier Campus Ministry, Office of Interfaith Community Engagement, and Brueggeman Center for Dialogue will be participating along with Happen Inc by hosting a Community Canvas for Compassion at 12 noon – 1pm at GSC Entrance on November 12th. Community Canvas, developed in 1999, is one of Happen's first traveling outreach activities. A print of a famous painting is enlarged to 6ft high by 10ft wide and then cut into diagonal strips that are woven into a chain link fence by participating children and adults. The reproduction creates a mural that stands for up to 30 days.
