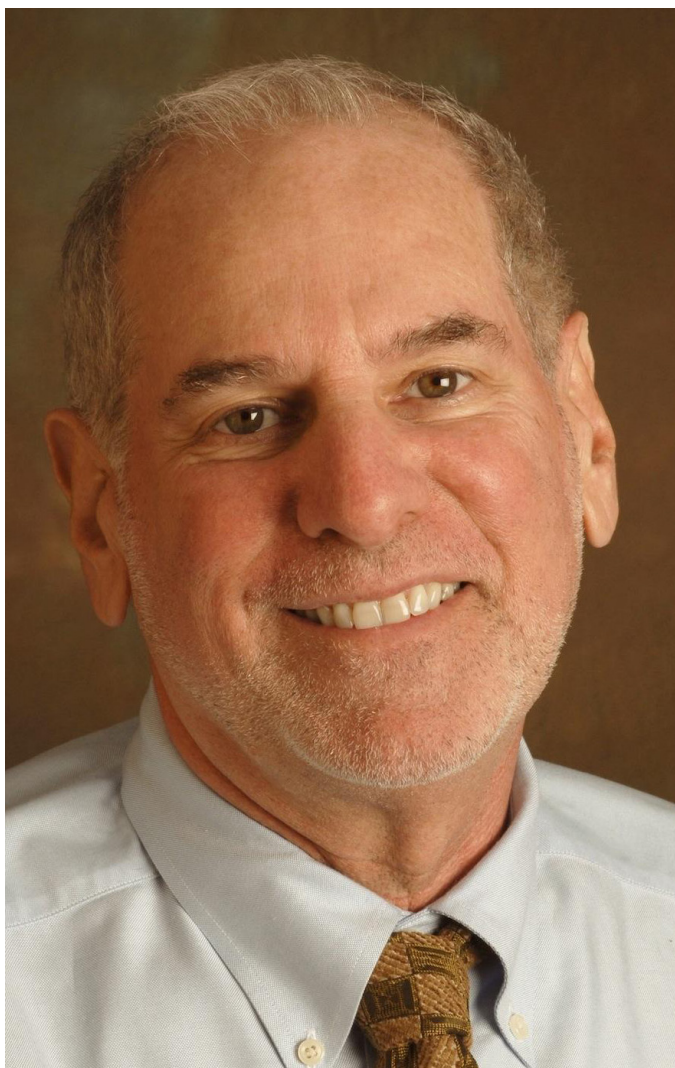

Philip “Uri” Treisman is professor of mathematics and of public affairs at The University of Texas at Austin. He is the founder and director of the University’s Charles A. Dana Center, an organized research unit of the College of Natural Sciences. Professor Treisman is also a senior partner at the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. For his contributions to the field of mathematics and for his efforts to advance minorities and women in the sciences and to strengthen American education, Dr. Treisman has received numerous honors and awards. In 1987 he received the Charles A. Dana Award for Pioneering Achievement in American Higher Education. In 1990, he was named by *Newsweek* as one of three American educators on the leading edge of innovation. He was named a MacArthur Fellow in 1992, one of the outstanding leaders of higher education in the 20th century by *Black Issues In Higher Education* in December 1999, and “2006 Scientist of the Year” by the Harvard Foundation of Harvard University.
