Fredin Memorial	Approximately \$12,000	One or two	Awarded on a competitive basis to students who will be juniors at Xavier and who wish to study abroad in France. The scholarship helps to cover the costs of one year of study at the Sorbonne in Paris. The scholarship is awarded based on academic qualifications.
