The following is a list of some of the resources and programs that Xavier offers to ensure your safety:

Code of Student Conduct

By being a registered Xavier University student, you have agreed to follow the code of student conduct as outlined in the Student Handbook. This code of conduct covers a variety of subjects ranging from underage alcohol consumption and hazing to hate crimes. During the summer, new students receive a letter from the Dean of Students, Luther Smith, Ph.D., with information on the code of conduct and the climate of respect. Emergency Preparedness

As part of Xavier's ongoing emergency preparedness efforts, the University established the Office of Emergency Management and Business Continuity. The office coordinates campus processes for the development, implementation and maintenance of the University's crisis/emergency plans. Extensive emergency plans are in place and reviewed often to ensure that campus personnel are prepared to activate the plans in a crisis. The Emergency Response Team (ERT) provides leadership and support before, during, and after a crisis. The ERT, campus police, and local police departments participate in training exercises to help us prepare for and work together to manage a crisis. XU Alert Me

Xavier has found a great way to alert everyone on campus when there is an emergency. Everyone who signs up for XU Alert Me will receive a text or a call when there is a snow day and classes are cancelled or when there is immediate danger. Campus Police

Shuttle Service

Xavier offers a shuttle service that runs within a one mile radius of campus. The shuttles operate on about 15-minute rotations. While the shuttle service provides a safer
