APPLYING TO XAVIER

Xavier wants students who are prepared to be successful academically and to contribute positively to the Xavier community as a whole. Transfer students may apply for fall or spring semester admission. Decisions will be mailed beginning in October and will continue on a rolling basis within three to four weeks of receiving all required application materials.

The \$35 application fee is waived for online applications.

- If you have less than 30 semester (45 quarter) hours of college credit, please ask your guidance/college counselor to complete the counselor recommendation and forward your application to Xavier with an official copy of your current high school transcript.
- Arrange for results of your SAT and/or ACT scores to be sent to Xavier (either from the testing companies or on your official high school transcript). Xavier's SAT code is 1965; the ACT code is 3366. **Please note: For Fall 2012 entry, neither the SAT nor ACT writing test is required or used for admission.**
- Mail the completed application and the nonrefundable \$35 application fee (check or money order, made payable to Xavier University) to Xavier's Office of Admission. For online applications, the \$35 fee is waived.

PLEASE NOTE:

If you are a transfer applicant with 30 or more hours, you do not need to submit the application essay, the counselor recommendation or SAT/ACT results. In addition to the application, transfers must submit official copies of academic transcripts from high school and all colleges previously attended, as well as a list of any courses in progress. Aid awards cannot be made until official transcripts are on file. Please note that transfer applicants should submit all credentials at least 30 days in advance of the desired semester's starting date.

IMPORTANT DATES AND DEADLINES

ADMISSION FOR FALL SEMESTER 2012

October 2011 Application review process begins for admission and scholarships.

Jan. 1, 2012 Submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible after this date; Xavier's code is 003144.

Feb. 15, 2012 Priority deadline to submit the FAFSA.

May 1, 2012 Postmark deadline to submit tuition and housing deposits to confirm enrollment at Xavier for fall semester.

June 15, 2012 For community college graduates only—deadline to apply for admission and be considered for Phi Theta Kappa scholarship. Phi Theta Kappa students do not need to submit a separate application.

Aug. 1, 2012 Deadline to apply for admission and be considered for the transfer scholarship.

Dates listed are postmark deadlines.

SCHOLARSHIP OVERVIEW

Transfer applicants who have achieved a 3.00 cumulative college GPA will be offered a transfer scholarship. Applicants who have achieved a 2.70-2.99 cumulative GPA will be offered the transfer achievement award. A separate scholarship application is not required. All transfer applicants are automatically considered. To ensure consideration, all application credentials for fall must be postmarked by Aug. 1, 2012.
