Awards in the FACHEX program are made on a competitive basis. Prospective candidates for FACHEX awards must apply Early Action, which has a deadline date of November 1. The parent's institution must also submit the necessary certification via the Tuition Exchange web site by December 15. Only prospective first-year, first time students will be considered.

All prospective, incoming first-year applicants who have completed the admissions process and been accepted for Early Action will be reviewed at the end of February. Xavier uses a holistic review process to determine the recipients of the FACHEX award, including (but not limited to) academic record, leadership, service, application essay and demonstrated interest.

Students will be informed by March 1 if they have been selected for the full-tuition scholarship award. To accept this award, Xavier must be notified by May 1.

Xavier expects to award (annually) up to 5 full-tuition scholarships in the FACHEX program.

Students attending Xavier University with a FACHEX award are eligible for undergraduate programs which are governed by the following guidelines:

- Recipients are granted tuition remission on a space available basis. Students must first meet all admission requirements and be accepted to Xavier University.
- The award is for full time students (12-18 hours) and only covers tuition. Students will be liable for a 10% user fee. The fee is 10% of the tuition charge each semester. It will be listed on the student's e-bill each semester.
- Recipients are not eligible for any additional Xavier funds (i.e. visit grant, study abroad grant, Catholic/Jesuit identity grant, housing grant, etc.).
- The award covers a maximum of eight (8) semesters of full-time attendance (for first year students) in the Fall/Spring semesters.
- Summer sessions are excluded.
- The student is responsible for all room and board charges as well as fees.
- Study Abroad Programs are excluded from the FACHEX program, unless the student is billed tuition for the program by Xavier University. If billed by Xavier, this would only be applicable in the Fall or Spring semester and for the normal study abroad tuition tier. Students would be responsible for the additional cost in Tier 1 and Tier 2.
- Students must maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average, complete at least 67% of their attempted classes, and be certified annually by their home campus in order for the award to be renewed.
