Incoming Students

Awards in the Tuition Exchange Program are made on a competitive basis. Prospective candidates for Tuition Exchange awards must apply Early Action, which has a deadline date of November 1. The parent's institution must also submit the necessary certification via the Tuition Exchange web site by December 15. Only prospective first-year, first time students will be considered.

All prospective, incoming first-year applicants who have completed the admissions process and been accepted for Early Action will be reviewed at the end of February. Xavier uses a holistic review process to determine the recipients of the Tuition Exchange award, including (but not limited to) academic record, leadership, service, application essay and demonstrated interest.

Students will be notified by March 1 if they have been selected for the full-tuition scholarship award. To accept or decline this award, Xavier must be notified by May 1.

Xavier expects to award (annually) up to 10 full-tuition scholarships in the Tuition Exchange Program. General information as well as a listing of participating colleges and universities is available on the [Tuition Exchange](#) web site.

Students entering Xavier University under the Tuition Exchange Program are eligible for the undergraduate programs governed by the following policies:

1. Students entering Xavier University under the Tuition Exchange Program are granted tuition remission on a space available basis. Students must first meet all admission requirements and be accepted into the University.
2. The award is for full time students (12-18 hours) and only covers tuition. Students will be liable for a 10% user's fee. The fee is 10% of the tuition charge each semester. The fee will be listed on the student's e-bill each semester. Recipients are not eligible for any additional Xavier funds (i.e. visit grant, study abroad grant, Catholic identity grant, housing grant, etc.). Exceptions may apply for those in student government or non-tuition restricted endowed scholarships.
3. Ohio residents may qualify for the Ohio College Opportunity Grant (OCOG) as determined by filing the FAFSA, which helps with the cost of tuition.
4. The student is responsible for all room and board charges as well as any fees.
5. Study Abroad Programs are excluded from the Tuition Exchange Program, unless the student is billed tuition for the program by Xavier University. This would only be applicable in the Fall or Spring semester.
6. Tuition Exchange isn't applicable for students in the ABSN program.
7. Tuition Exchange covers a maximum of eight (8) semesters of full-time attendance. Summer sessions are excluded.

8. Students must maintain at least a 2.0 grade point average, complete at least 67% of their attempted classes, and be certified annually by their home campus in order for the award to be renewed.
