- 1. Common (public) schools: Define "common school," and describe the "educational ladder" concept within the common/public school system. Who are significant persons or groups involved with--and their respective contributions toward--establishing the common school? Describe the status of the common school today in the United States. How would you grade (assess or evaluate) today's common/public school system? Why? Provide evidence.
- 2. Reforms in public schools: Identify 2 major reform movements in the history of public schools in the United States. Describe the important policy and legislative elements, as well as social elements, of the reforms. How did the reforms impact practice in schools and school districts, and how were students directly impacted?
- 3. Philosophical/theoretical orientations to teaching: Identify and define two (2) major philosophies or theories of education. Next, what is your philosophy of education? State the roots or grounding of your philosophy. How do you (or how will you) apply it? Further, what appears to be the dominant educational theory or philosophy of education today? Name it and explain it. What is your evidence?

- 5. What is the constitutional basis for the federal government's role in education? Support your opinion with facts, references, and examples.
