



## **Using Subject Databases**

Databases can help you find sources that focus on subject areas in your topic.



From the <u>Library home page</u>, select the DATABASES tab.

Find DATABASES ARRANGED BY SUBJECT.



Use the drop down menu to find subject disciplines that might be related to your topic.

For example, if your topic is "Does packaging color impact consumer purchasing decisions?"

Some subject areas that might be relevant to this question are Marketing, Psychology, and Art.
