



OBTAINING A COPY OF AN ARTICLE IN A BIBLIOGRAPHY

If you are working from a list of references in a bibliography, a printout of your search results, or you want a known article from a particular journal, use the following steps to obtain a copy of an article you need.

1. Go to [JOURNALS @ XU](#)
2. Type all or part of the journal's title in the search box.
3. Click the **Search** button.

2. Some of the displayed entries may be books as indicated by the book icon  (not shown in image below).
3. If you do not see any results for the journal title you entered, then we do not have that journal in digital format. Click the **Request Article/ILLiad** tab to request these journal articles.
4. If there are results for the journal you want, one or more databases will display under the journal title.
5. Make sure the database covers the year your journal article was published.
6. Click the database link.

1. The database you clicked will open (each database may have a different look from that displayed here).
2. The database will display the years of the journal that are available in full-text format.
3. Click the year you want and it will display available issues.
4. Click the issue you want.
