For Non-Business Majors

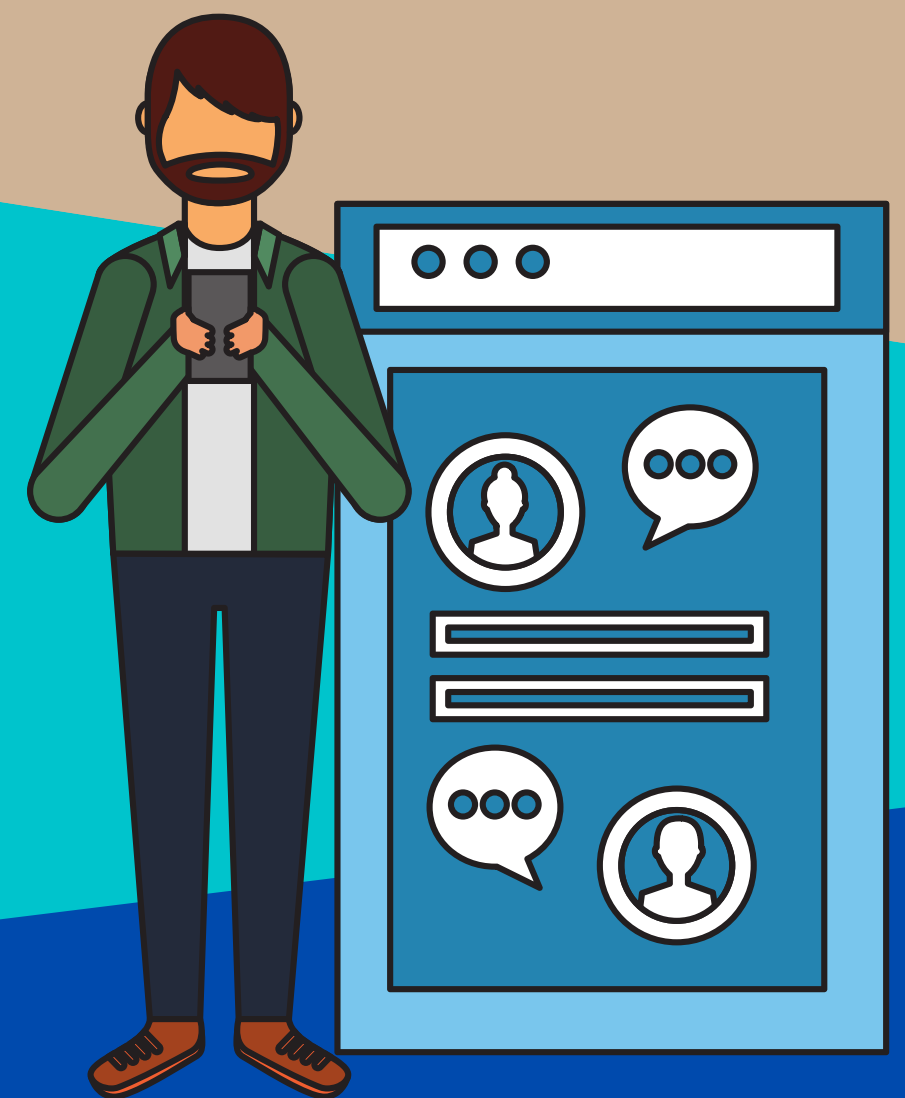


You're already working to be an expert in your major field. Augment your expertise with management skills valuable to all employees.

2. Choose four classes from courses like:

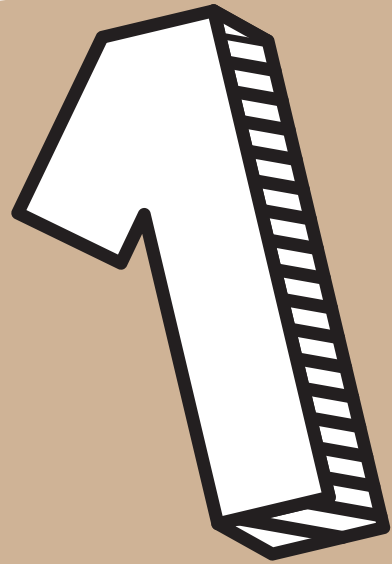
