My AFMIX Experience

The AFMIX experience has been quite a personal journey for me. I really felt "connected" to this group as we shared our thoughts, challenges, frustrations grounded by our assigned readings and personal reflections. This experience was truly a gift! It allowed me to experience Ignatian spirituality through a different prism regarding my prayer life. I discovered a prayer life rooted in daily reflection, appreciation of one another and a desire to share my feelings (not something I am always willing to do).

So, one might ask, how will the AFMIX experience impact my work at Xavier differently? As I see it, it has crystalized how I must remain deeply present to each and every student, faculty/staff, alumni, parent and friend of this University. Much of what I do in my professional life centers around building relationships with people; making them feel good about themselves and the University. I help them to get in touch with their passion in life which usually translates to something positive for the University. AFMIX has helped me more fully appreciate my role and responsibility to bring the gifts of Ignatius Loyola to everyone I meet. I have been given many gifts and advantages in my life, perhaps the greatest gift is the every present desire to find God in all things. This is not always easy in the world as it exists today. AFMIX has allowed me to breathe deeply, reflect more frequently, fall in love more often, and imagine the possibilities.
