application specialist to request additional information.

- d. If eligibility requirements are met applicant will receive Eligibility letter with instructions regarding registration with Pearson VUE. Approval is transferred to Pearson VUE.
- e. Upon passing the licensure examination the initial license is issued within 7-10 days.

The candidate will fill out an application; the candidate may if the candidate chooses, utilize the online system. The application can be viewed on the Board site. It includes questions about education, student loan and child support status, and medical conditions that could impede practice. The candidate will need to pay a fee to the New Jersey Board.

A candidate must have a criminal background check. In New Jersey, printing is done electronically through MorphoTrak for a fee. A candidate who has already been fingerprinted by the New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs after November 2003 will not need to have fingerprints done again, but will need to have another background check run (for a fee). This will apply to some individuals who have already applied to the Board for a lower level of licensing.

The candidate will also need to register with Pearson VUE to take the NCLEX-RN and pay the testing fee. Once eligibility has been determined, the candidate will receive an ATT in the mail (or via email). At this point, the candidate can schedule an exam.
