## **PSYC Major Course Requirements: 38 Hours**

- Students must complete a minimum of 38 credit hours of PSYC coursework.
- If a student completes a course outside of PSYC for substitute credit for a requirement, those credit hours do not count toward the 38 hour requirement and must be made up with PSYC elective hours.

-Full Language Sequence: 101 - 102 - 201 -Students are provided Placement Score during initial admission: Elementary I: Begin with 101, then 102, then 201 Elementary II: Begin with 102, then 201 Intermediate I: Take 201

## **Free Elective Hours Required**

- Students must complete a minimum of 120 total credit hours. PSYC Major Courses + Core Courses will not total 120 hours. Students reach the 120 credit hours using free electives (any XU courses), which can also be applied toward a minor.
- Pre-requisite courses taken in order to move on to required Core courses (MATH 120, Language 102, etc.) will count toward Free Electives
- Keep in mind repeated courses will only count toward total credit hours once. For example, if a student takes PSYC 130 and receives a C- and retakes it later for an A, they will only receive 2 total credits from both attempts.
