### **Report of Administration: Dr. Andrew Zolides**

- Advisor of Take It On; support opportunities for civic engagement on campus
- Civic engagement does not just mean GOTV efforts or talking about issues or candidates on the ballot
  - Involves anything that has public importance
- Working with OSI and Dean making clear guidelines and procedures allowing students to engage politically
