 - 91 are indigenous
 - 2 are non indigenous (Chinese and Spanish)
 - 7 are institutional
 - 37 are developing
 - 5 are vigorous
 - 29 are in trouble
 - 15 are dying

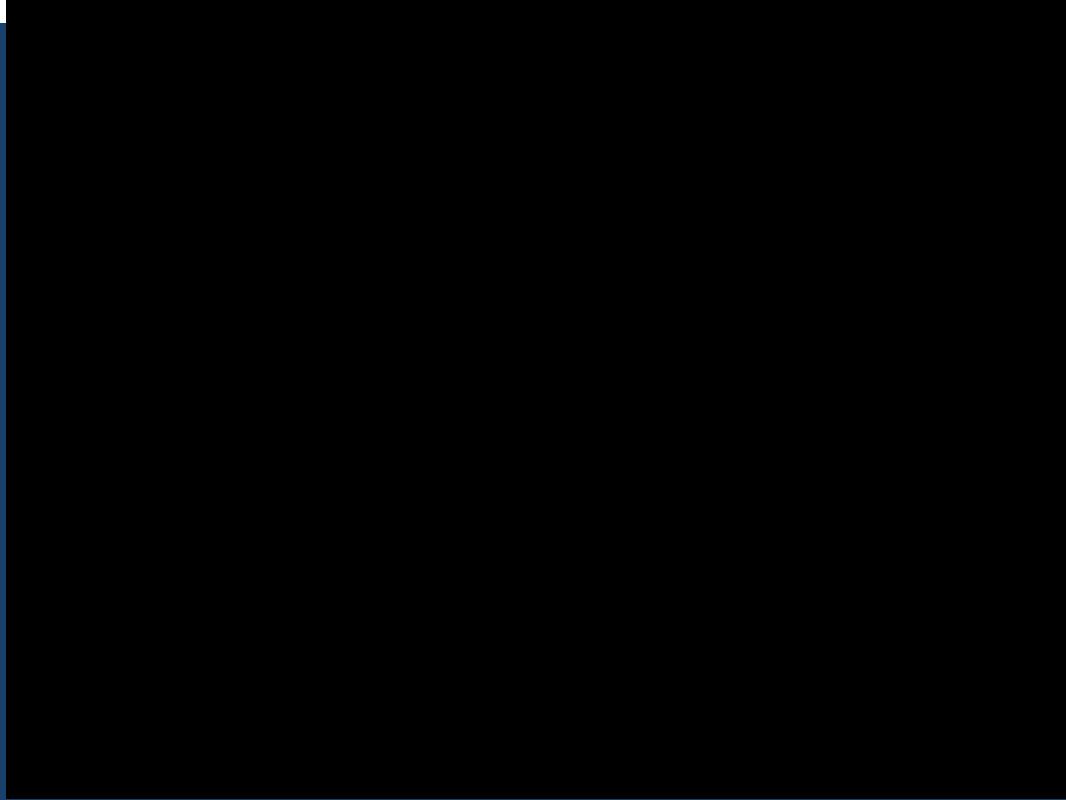

Academics

- Courses are each worth 3 or 4 credit
- Spanish Language Courses (2)
- 2 courses directly enrolled in courses taught in Spanish, with Peruvian classmates
- Elective courses taught in English:
 - Possible topics: Peruvian History and Culture, Building Sustainable Communities, Social Inequality in Latin America, Theology in Latin America.
- March to July or August to December



Suggested Courses in Spanish

Anthropology – theoretical course, knowledge and analysis of the person in its cultural context, with emphasis on the Peruvian experience

Contemporary Latin America – contemporary history of Latin America, political, economic and social processes from the 20th century to the present

Ecology and Biodiversity – principles of ecology and the functions of ecosystems, delving into Peruvian biodiversity and the role this plays worldwide

History of the Peruvian Republic – transformations of the Peruvian economy and politics in the Latin American and world context from 1826 through the end of the 20th century

History of Prehispanic y Viceroyalty Peru – Peruvian history from the origins of the Andean civilization to independence

Peruvian Literature – overview of Peruvian literature and the construction of the national imaginary

Community Engagement

- Interested students are matched with volunteer opportunities at local Jesuit social projects based on skills, training, and availability
- Each project is rooted in social justice, empowerment, and faith
- Projects provide connections to Peruvians and the reality of living in Lima today
