#### **ITAL 102 ELEMENTARY ITALIAN II**

Prerequisite: Completion of ITAL 101 or equivalent.

This course emphasizes a communicative, culture-based approach to the four skills of reading, writing, speaking, and listening, while also helping to develop cultural competency. This course consists of several components and enables the learner to function in everyday situations using authentic language and culturally appropriate behavior.

### STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

AT THE END OF THIS COURSE, STUDENTS WILL:

- Describe their daily activities and routines using present tense verbs, including reflexive verbs
- Narrate activities in the past using the passato prossimo and imperfetto tenses
- Make polite requests and ask for permission
- Talk about leisure and weekend activities
- Compare and contrast Italian holiday celebrations with American holiday celebrations
- Express surprise, disbelief, regret, and sorrow in a culturally appropriate manner
- Ask about others' future plans, and talk about their own
- Ask for information about past events, and describe how things used to be
- Discuss the Italian educational system and compare it with the American educational system



## CRITERIA FOR CLASS PARTICIPATION



### Superior - 100 - 90

greeted people and took leave using Italian expressions

When I entered the classroom and sat down, I opened my books to the topics we were studying wasn't on my phone during class

actively participated in all activities and discussions and had a positive attitude

### Average - 89 - 77

I showed interest in activities and participated, though sometimes passively rather than actively generally came prepared to class

I participated sometimes in class

### Unsatisfactory - 76 - 60

used more English than Italian in class, and/or spoke rarely (if at all)

I did not pay active attention during activities

had to be told multiple times to work in groups or with a partner

was on my phone before class started and I didn't open my book or get my materials out until the instructor told me to do so

I was often distracted, distracting, and/or disrespectful of my peers

texted /wrote messages in class, was on my phone, and/or looked at other websites

was frequently unprepared for class

was often absent, late, and/or frequently left the room during class

My presence in group work had little impact on accomplishing the task

I seldom participated in class and rarely ever volunteered to answer anything

### Not enough to evaluate - 59 - 0

I used English only in class, or never spoke

I did not pay attention during activities

I refused to work in groups with anyone, or never spoke during group work

I was disrespectful and had a bad attitude

I often was on my phone, looking at other websites, or sleeping during class

I was excessively absent

I came to class late, left early, and/or frequently left the room
