Students will learn about manifestations of dementia and strategies implemented from varied professional disciplines to improve the quality of life for persons with dementia.

- 1. Read the **common readings** on working in teams and **discipline descriptions**.
- 2. Review the **case** and **investigate appropriate service/treatments** for the patient from your professional point of view.
- 3. Prepare to share ideas from your discipline with others on your team using the individual discipline preparation form.
- 4. Locate your **team assignment** on the team assignment spreadsheet.
